TOPIC: IN THE BEGINNING

TEXT: Isaiah 43:18-19, Hebrews 11:3

BIBLE READING: (For the week) – Hebrews 11:1-end

INTRODUCTION:

New beginnings to us as believers refer to the start or formation of things that did not exist before. This includes becoming more of the person God desires us to be in character and conduct. Also new experiences in various areas of our lives, as well as innovative ways of solving problems for others borne out of a heart of love. In creating the earth, God made man in His image and likeness with the intent that man would carry on the work which He began. As co-creators with God therefore, we must remember that only what is built in alignment with His plans and purpose will stand the test of time. Hence, we must be mindful to build according to His pattern (Hebrews 8:5). Our aim should be to see His will done on earth, just as it is in heaven. Revelation from God's Word is the raw material by which we frame our worlds and create the future that God has already designed for us. For there to be new beginnings, there must be the end of some things in our lives. We must realize that certain seasons have ended and be ready to detach ourselves from them as the Spirit of God leads us.

DISCUSSION: (Points To Note)

The following are some points for us to note:

1. Go after revelation. Meditate in the Scriptures and continually spend time praying both in understanding and in the Spirit. (Joshua 1:8, 1 Cor. 14:15).
2. Let go of the past. (Phil. 3:12-13) Refuse to be weighed down by past failures and mistakes. Break away from certain mindsets, habits, and associations in order to allow God's plans find expression in and through you.
3. Be sensitive to words spoken under inspiration by God's ministers (1 Tim. 1:18). You can also speak out prophetic utterances through the Spirit of God who lives in you.
4. Give generously to support the work of God. Do this, not out of compulsion, but with a cheerful heart (2 Cor. 9:6-10).
5. Act on what God has said. Let everything you do be done in love. (James 1:22-25, 1 Cor. 14:1).

CONCLUSION: ()

In the journey of new beginnings, God does not just create new circumstances, He first creates a new you. We believers have been made new creatures in Christ (2 Cor. 5:17). This is the starting point for seeing God's will established on the earth. At the new birth, we become new creatures, and this makes possible new experiences and exploits that are in alignment with God's purpose. To ensure that we build what brings glory to God not just in our lifetime but also for posterity, let us make a commitment to walk closely with God, listen to Him and do all that He asks us to do.
